Description of the activity, equipment or area under assessment

The Indoor Cricket School hosts a variety of activity, including Cricket training, general sports training and exams. The building has one main entrance, a reception area with an office, a plant room, 1x male changing room, 1x female changing room and a disabled changing room (all with toilet facilities), and a large sports hall

Personal Injury	Slips, trips or falls.	Low	Maintenance helpdesk system in place with in University system and all areas monitored daily by Sports Service staff to ensure areas are maintained appropriately. Floors appropriate for the areas (e.g. non slip floors in showers and changing facilities). All areas cleaned regularly spot checks undertaken by staff as necessary. First Aid provision and Emergency procedures details on display around site. Sports Service staff on site during all opening hours and can isolate any problem areas. Signage and locks in place to prevent unauthorised access to some areas. Code of Conduct in place for all users To use the facility it must be pre booked through MRM Sports staff on duty to ensure inappropriate activities do not take place and isolate any problem areas Bookings for young people always accompanied by responsible adults. Electrical Equipment PAT Tested annually by Estate Management. Annual documented Health and Safety Inspections. First aiders on site during working hours	All sports equipment to be stored securely on site with controlled access, items are to be stored appropriately on storage trolleys and in proper storage areas.
